

Portfolio projects

1. A **portfolio project's** guidelines are typically distributed to students in a **pocket folder**.
2. Inside the **pocket folder** students will find a list of the assignments that will be a part of the project. This list will provide point values and describe the required and optional portions of the **portfolio**.
3. Often, there will also be a list of enrichment or extra credit options. Should the student complete these with acceptable proficiency, the added points could raise the student's grade above 100%.
4. On the side of the portfolio pocket folder that contains the list of assignment students should also keep handouts received to guide portions of their work.
5. Not all finished components of the **portfolio** will fit inside the folder. Those too large to fit in the folder will be placed in a specific place in the classroom.
6. Some of the assignments in the **pocket folder** will have rubrics attached.
7. Students should keep track of the points they earned.
8. You might be tested on some of the **portfolio projects** and should manage graded portions carefully to use for review.
